#### Foundation

Your teacher will supply you with a pre-recorded electronic drone or you may create your own electronic drone.



#### Rhythmic Cells (Atmospheric Pulse)

Choose a rhythmic cell. Play as written, change the order of measures, or even repeat certain elements within each cell. Use any sounds you like (household "found sounds" or electronic). Be creative!

Play a motif as written, change the order of measures, or even repeat certain phrases within each motif.

### Composition and Improvisation – add your own voice!

RHYTHMIC CELL: Create your own rhythmic cell (it can be one measure or up to four measures). If you prefer, you may improvise a rhythmic cell instead.



MOTIF: Create your own motif using **only the notes provided.** You may not compose more than 2 measures! (Advanced players may choose additional octaves to expand beyond the range of a 6th)





MELODY: Create or improvise a melody based on the motif you composed. It should be four to eight measures long.





COUNTERMELODY: On the staff below, write the second half of your **melody.** (If you improvised your melody, then transcribe the second half of it below.)



On the staff below, write a **countermelody:** music that compliments what you wrote above.



COLOR, DISSONANCE, INTENSITY: Compose or improvise a passage using the notes provided. Do not be afraid to take a risk and explore some interesting note combinations!
